

World Soil Day Celebration Be the Solution to Soil Pollution Monday, 3 December 2018 (13:15-14:30) Conference Room 12 UN Headquarters, New York

On 20 December 2013, the 68th Session of the United Nations General Assembly designated **5 December** as World Soil Day (WSD). Soil, like air and water, is fundamental for life on earth. Although there is an intrinsic association of food production with soils, they also provide us with clean water, fuel, building materials, fiber, habitat, medicines and nutrients.

Taking note of the importance of soils for food security and nutrition, food safety, sustainable development and human health, the theme for the World Soil Day celebration 2018 is "Be the solution to soil pollution". The observance will pay special tribute to His Majesty the late King Bhumibol Adulyadej of Thailand, a soil scientist and advocate for sustainable soil management, on whose birthday World Soil Day is celebrated.

World Soil Day is a major platform to raise awareness at the international, regional and national levels about the essential role of soils for human life. This event in New York will celebrate World Soil Day 2018 as part of the efforts to promote sustainable soil management, which support our path towards the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
